# Angel (“a messenger from God”– Oxford Dictionary)

I believe in Angels. Not the winged angels of poetry and art but those we meet in the Bible like the 3 men who visited Abraham and Sarah in Genesis 11. I also believe that during my lifetime there have been many angels with messages from God and there are probably many in our community giving that extra care and love that only angels can bring. I want to tell you about my special angel without whom my life would have been much different to the one I now enjoy.

From the age of seven I always wanted to serve God as a priest and worked toward this during my school years. I didn't pass the 11 plus but by the time I was in 4<sup>th</sup> year at the Secondary Modern School there was an opportunity to take 'O' levels GCEs. Having gained 5 passes I needed to stay on a 5<sup>th</sup> year to take French. My angel – my form teacher – said to me, “Bernard, you can't just stay on and take one subject. I explained I was doing 2. “Still not enough” he said. So I replied, “Ok Sir, so what do you suggest.” “Principles of Accounts boy.”

“What do I need accounts for, Sir”. “Well,” came the angel's reply. “You could do the church accounts couldn't you?”

So I took the advice and surprisingly passed with distinction.

When I left school I was too young to attend a Church Selection Board so needed a job. I didn't even need to look, as the angel just got me a position working in the office of Crisps Garage using my accountancy knowledge. I later spent 18 months working for the Prudential in Romford before, having passed a Selection Board, the church sent me to the Hostel of the Resurrection to begin my training. This was followed by a year at Bernard Gilpin Durham before getting a place at Salisbury Theological College.

While in Durham my angel, who by then was a teacher at a nearby Comprehensive School, got in contact and one Sunday, along with his wife and 6 year old son, took me on a tour from Gretna down to Lake Ullswater and back to college. Sadly I never saw him again.

At Salisbury I made what turned out to be a disastrous decision to get married, only to discover my wife suffered from what is now called Bi-Polar and so I left college and my vocation to try and look after her. It was a difficult and unhappy period.

I firmly believe that God, knowing I was going to lose my way, had sent my angel to ensure I would eventually get through those dark days.

Because the angel had not only taught me accounts, but also payroll, I was able to get an accounts position with a small engineering firm in Ipswich, where I stayed for 16 years and which helped keep me stable and solvent.

There have been other angels, including the one I am now married to, but they are for another time perhaps. But I am convinced that my school teacher, Richard Dent, was sent by God so that I would be prepared. And, of course, I do help with the church accounts!



### **Julian Larkin MA (Oxon), ARCO.**

Organist and harpsichordist Julian Larkin was Parry-Wood Organ Scholar at Exeter College, Oxford. His career has embraced teaching, both in schools and privately, examining, performing and adjudicating. After taking lessons with and participating in master classes under the distinguished harpsichordist the late George Malcolm, he gave recitals at Wigmore Hall and the Purcell Room, South Bank and organ recitals at many London churches, including St Paul's Cathedral. His career as examiner for ABRSM and LCM, adjudicator and concert artist has taken him throughout Britain and Eire, to many European and Asian countries and to New Zealand. His recordings include a solo CD "*Four Centuries of Organ Music*", made on the 1895 Walker organ of St. Michael's Church, Amersham and released on the Priory Label and the CD of a live concert at St Martin-in-the-Fields, London, as organ soloist with the Chamber Ensemble of London, in which he played works by Bach, Handel & Mozart. Julian has lived in Suffolk since 2012.

**Julian has very kindly agreed to give an organ and harpsichord recital at St. Margaret's Church on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> July. The concert will start at 3pm and there will be a retiring collection. Light refreshments will be served during the interval and, as always, there will be a raffle. ## Framlingham in Wartime

2019 marks the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the outbreak of the Second World War and also the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of D Day. The Alde Valley Suffolk Family History Group's next talk is based around John Bridges' latest book, *A Suffolk Town in Wartime, Framlingham 1939 to 1945* and considers the many changes and local events that took place throughout that period. Most towns had ARP, Fire, Police and Ambulance preparations in hand before war broke out, but the provision of air raid shelters and a siren would not become a reality until much later, by which time lives had been lost.

The illustrated talk, with sound effects, will cover many subjects of interest including Evacuees, Invasion threat, Defence of the town, Home Guard, ARP, War Agricultural Executive Committees, Bombing raids, Rationing and more. John Bridges is President of the Framlingham & District Local History & Preservation Society. His interest in family history has enabled him to trace his origins in the town back to the 1720s when his five-time great grandfather Silvanus set up as a blacksmith in Double Street. John has written other books on Framlingham and also a history of the motor car in Suffolk.

The talk will be at 7.30pm on Friday 19 July at Kelsale Village Hall, Bridge Street, Kelsale, IP17 2PB. Admission is £1 for members, £3 for non-members, including tea/coffee. NB. # ST MARGARET

My tour of the Saints in the East window seems appropriate to start with the Saint our church is dedicated to - St Margaret of Antioch (sometimes referred to as Saint Marina.) She is thought to have lived in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Century in Antioch in Syria and her feast day is kept on 20 July. In our window she is depicted holding a sword with a cross shaped handle but elsewhere is associated with a dragon. Virgin martyrs are often depicted wearing crowns. Margaret is the patron saint of pregnancy and childbirth.



Her mother having died soon after her birth, Margaret was nursed by a Christian woman several miles from Antioch. Having embraced Christianity Margaret was disowned by her father, adopted by her nurse, and lived in the country keeping sheep with her foster mother (in what is now Turkey). Margaret allegedly refused to marry a high ranking official or to renounce her Christian faith and after trial and torture was beheaded. One story told about Margaret is that Satan, disguised as a dragon, swallowed Margaret - she escaped unharmed when the cross she carried irritated the dragon's innards. As Marina she is associated with the sea. During the medieval period Margaret was one of the most famous saints and her voice was said to have been heard by Joan of Arc.
